POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

General Policies of SCTC -Promoting a Healthy Working Environment

Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Policy

All persons entering SCTC must comply with the Alcohol/Drug-Free Campus Policy as required by Public Law 101-226, No person may bring, keep, or drink alcoholic beverages on college premises or at college functions. Possession of stimulants, depressants, narcotics, or hallucinogenic drugs - including marijuana and other agents having the potential for abuse - is strictly prohibited.







General Policies of SCTC -Inclement Weather

Cancellation of on-campus classes due to inclement weather or other conditions will be announced by the college on the www.sagchip.edu website, Schoology, the SCTC Facebook page, staff email, WCFX 95.3 FM, TV 9-10, WJRT Channel 12, and WNEM Channel 5.

The cancellation of evening classes will normally be announced before 5 p.m. Class cancellation due to the absence of the instructor is posted the day of the cancellation via student sagchip.edu email accounts.

PROTECTING OUR STUDENTS - ADA

Americans with Disabilities Act

Students with a documented disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 are eligible to receive reasonable accommodation and disabilityrelated services. Under the law, a person has a disability if he or she has a mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities (walking, standing, seeing, speaking, hearing, sitting, breathing, and taking care of oneself).



Students are responsible for:

- 1) Providing SCTC with appropriate documentations of their disabilities
- 2) Contacting Dean of Students to receive reasonable accommodation.
