Course Delivery Definitions**:

F2F (Face to Face) | A course that has regularly scheduled class times and meets in person.

ON-S (Online Synchronous) | A course that meets via web-based technologies and has regularly scheduled class times.

H (Hybrid) | There will be regularly scheduled face-to-face meeting times and online components within a hybrid course. The online components may be delivered synchronously or asynchronously. Both face-to-face meeting times and online delivery methods must be scheduled in the syllabus.
