**Course Delivery Definitions\*\*:**  
 F2F | A regular course that meets face to face as indicated on the semester schedule.  
 ONLINE | A course that meets asynchronously via web-based technologies.  
 HYBRID | A hybrid course will meet face to face for a minimum of 50% of the course, i.e. students must complete 22.5 hours of actual seat time on campus. Faculty may add a live synchronous, web-based component to the course (not more than 50% of the course). Both face to face components and web-based delivery methods must be scheduled on the syllabus.
